Rotary Model United Nations Program Checklist

- ❑ Select a Rotarian from your Club to head this effort. They do not need any prior experience with Model United Nations, only an interest, enthusiasm, and desire to co-create an exciting new project!
- ❑ Seek approval from your Club to participate in this project. Depending upon the structure of your club, this might fall under a committee, go through a board, or just need informal discussion.
- ❑ The District 5340 Model United Nations Steering Committee will provide all the materials or references needed for you to prepare. In addition, training of students and advisors will be offered over the next few months. We are here to support you however we can.
- ❑ Seek out a neighborhood high school to partner with.
- ❑ Approach the school regarding the program. The school may designate an advisor to work with you, who can be a teacher or other faculty member. The school advisor is not a requirement as it will be the designated Rotarians in your Club carrying the ball. In the event that a Rotarian is not available to act as advisor, a teacher is perfectly acceptable.
- ❑ Select two students per team to participate in the 2011 conference. Remember, a club may sponsor more than one team if they wish.
- ❑ The cost of sponsoring a team is \$600. This will need to be appropriated from your Club budget, and covers all expenses for two students and one advisor.
- ❑ The advisor will work with the students to prepare for the conference, beginning approximately eight to ten weeks before the event.
- ❑ The District 5340 Model UN Conference will take place the weekend of May 14th.-15th., 2011. It will be held at the Joan B. Kroc Institute For Peace & Justice, University Of San Diego
